New Voices, New Perspectives Student Research Conference March 1 - 2, 2013

The student conference theme "New Voices, New Perspectives" highlights the interdisciplinary approach of the conference. The scope of this conference is broad and may encompass a variety of areas including rhetoric, performance, organizational communication, interpersonal communication, computer-mediated communication, health communication, and pedagogy. Monetary awards are presented

for top undergraduate and top graduate research.

The conference has grown exponentially over the past 5 years. In 2012, 63 graduate and undergraduate students, representing 18 colleges and universities, and 9 states presented their research at the UNT conference. The keynote address for the conference this year will be provided by Dr. Carole Blair, Professor of Rhetorical Studies at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill.

Professor Blair received her B.A. and M.A. degrees from the University of Iowa, and her Ph.D. from Pennsylvania State University. Her research focuses on the rhetorical and cultural significance of U.S. commemorative places and artworks. She teaches related courses on visual and material rhetorics, rhetoric and memory, and rhetorics of place, as well as on contemporary rhetorical theory and criticism.



Submissions:

- Complete papers should include a 50-75 word abstract.
- Panel submissions should include panel tites, abstract, rationale, and detailed abstracts for proposed papers. Please indicate in the submission which research track the panel addresses whether rhetoric, interpersonal/organizational, or performance studies.
- The title of the paper should not include any author references. Please remove all author references in the text of the paper.
- In e-mail please provide name(s), e-mail address(es), and phone number(s) of the author(s). The e-mail should also indicate if it is an undergraduate or graduate submission.
- A \$10 individual registration fee is required and a lunch will be provided. To insure that your name is included in the program, please send cash or a check at least two weeks before the conferece.
